Brief Daily Itinerary

Tuesday, May 5 - New York – Frankfurt

Evening departure for Frankfurt, Germany. Dinner and breakfast will be served during the flight.

Wednesday, May 6 – Arrive Frankfurt – Rhine Cruise – Mainz

Early morning arrival in Frankfurt. After completing arrival formalities we will begin our motorcoach tour. Our private motorcoach will take us through the Upper Rhine Plain to Mainz where we board a Rhine steamer for a three-hour cruise along the most legendary part of the Rhine Valley to St. Goarshausen. After Rudesheim, pass the “mice tower” and the Romantic towns of Bacharach, Kaub and Oberwessel. See the legendary Lorelei Rock where, according to folklore, beautiful mermaids once lived. Vine-laden hillsides and castles abound on this cruise. In the afternoon we will visit the **Gutenberg**

Museum in Mainz where there is a reproduction of Gutenberg’s printing house and a copy of the Bible he printed is on display. Mainz is the capital of the Land of Rhineland Palatinate, a university city, and the city of Gutenberg. Transfer to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

Thursday, May 7 – Heidelberg – Worms – Freiburg

After breakfast we head south with a photo stop at the Luther Monument in Worms. Our next stop is Heidelberg, the oldest University town in Germany and home of the “Student Prince.” View the medieval Town Hall and the University, founded in 1386. Cross the Neckar River and drive to the ancient castle high above the city and river. Continue to Freiburg.

Friday, May 8 – Freiburg – Rhine Falls – Lucerne

Early morning departure, via the thunderous Rhine Falls and Basel to Lucerne. Its attractive waterfront, covered wooden bridges and medieval walls make Lucerne one of Switzerland’s loveliest cities. Walk along quaint winding streets of the Old Town and see the 14th century wooden Chapel Bridge and the Lion Monument. Free time to stroll along the bridges, relax on the lake shore or visit the elegant shops.

Saturday, May 9 – Lucerne

Today drive through the lovely Obwalden Valley past Lakes Sarnen and Lungern. Follow the Bruenig Pass road to Interlaken, a popular summer resort noted for its attractive flower gardens and its view of the Jungfrau massif. From there proceed to Lauterbrunnen to see the Trummelbach Falls inside the rocks. Return to the hotel for the night.

Sunday, May 10 – Interlaken – Lichenstein – Innsbruck

Depart along the shores of the Walensee and Lake Zurich to Innsbruck, the Tyrolean capital of Austria. This 800-year old university town was named for the bridge

across the Inn River, first built in the 12th century. On your orientation tour of Innsbruck, view the Goldenes Dachl (Golden Roof), a late Gothic oriel with 2,657 gold-plated tiles built under the rule of Emperor Maximilian I as a royal box for spectacles held in the square below. Innsbruck was the site of the 1964 and 1976 Winter Olympics. (Arrangements will be made for worship.)

Monday, May 11 – Innsbruck – Salzburg

Admire the majestic mountain scenery as you travel east through the Kitzbuheler Alps towards Salzburg, one of the world's most beautiful cities. Salzburg is a city of music and will always be remembered as the birthplace of Mozart and in more recent time for The Sound of Music.

Our sightseeing tour of Salzburg takes us past the most important corners and the most beautiful sights. Drive via Schloss Mirabell and the Kongresshaus. Continue via the Schwarzsstrasse and the Protestant Church to the Mozarteum, and then past the Marionetten Theater, Landes Theater, Marktplatz, and Rathaus to view where Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart was born.

Tuesday, May 12 – Salzburg – Oberammergau – Neuschwanstein – Munich Area

Depart today for the village of Oberammergau where, every ten years, the citizens present their day long Passion Play depicting the last week in the life of Christ. Enjoy this unique Alpine village where you will also have the opportunity to purchase some of their famous wood carvings. Then continue to the Bavarian Alps and mad King Ludwig's fairy-tale Neuschwanstein Castle, one of the most photographed palaces in the world and the model for the castles at the Walt Disney theme parks. Following a castle tour, proceed to the Munich area.

Wednesday, May 13 – Munich

Munich was ruled for over 650 years by the Wittelsbacher dukes and kings, who left their mark on

the architecture and founded the world famous Munich Art Collection. On your orientation tour, drive via Karolinenplatz to the Olympic Stadium, built for the 1972 Olympics. Proceed past the 1,000-foot-high Television Tower to Nymphenburg, the former Royal Residence. Then on to Odeon Square with the beautiful Theatine Church and the Hall of Generals. After a visit to the Dachau concentration camp, there will be leisure time in the afternoon. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Thursday, May 14 – Munich – Augsburg – Rothenburg ob der Tauber – Rhine Valley

Travel to Augsburg, named for Augustus Caesar who founded the city in 14 B.C. Here, in 1530, the Diet of Augsburg proclaimed the Protestant Confession the ultimate statement of Lutheran belief. The Cathedral, dating from the 10th century, has the oldest stained glass windows in Germany. Maximilianstrasse is the finest Renaissance street in all Germany. A brief stop will allow those who wish to visit the Roman museum at Augsburg Cathedral to do so.

Continue north on the Romantic Road through fairy tale towns surrounded by moats, gates and towers. Admire the landscape dotted with lovely church spires standing since the Middle Ages. Drive to Nordlingen, a traditional village where the watchman's calls echoing through the night still reassure the villagers. Continue to Rothenburg ob der Tauber, Germany's best preserved medieval town. Rothenburg's ramparts, cobbled roads and high gabled houses invoke the romance of the Middle Ages. The battle-scarred walls that encircle the town still protect St. Jakobskirch, with its altar carving by Tilman Riemenschneider. After a short visit continue to the Rhine Valley for the night.

Friday, May 15 – Frankfurt – U.S.A.

Your European journey comes to an end with memories of a lovely trip and good friends. We board our return flight back to the United States, arriving the same day.

Upon receipt of your deposit we will send you our *Helpful Hints for Travelers*. Informational bulletins will be sent periodically. Information about the places you will visit will be supplied to each tour member. The total price of the tour including all fees and tips is \$4215. General Conditions

RESERVATIONS, DEPOSITS and FINAL PAYMENT:

Reservations may be secured upon payment of a deposit of \$500 per person. No reservation is considered firm until deposit has been received. Your initial deposit payment shall be deemed to be an acceptance of all the terms of our General Conditions. Space is limited and offered on a first-come basis. Final payment is due at Nawas Travel 100 days prior to departure date.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: A U.S.A. passport valid for 6 months after the return date of the trip is required to travel. It is the sole responsibility of the traveler to check their passport's expiration date. NonU.S.A. citizens may require visas in addition to a valid passport. It is the sole responsibility of non-U.S.A. citizens (including green card holders) to ensure they have the required visas/travel documents for each country to be visited on their tour and for re-entry into the U.S.A. Visa fees (if any) are not included in the tour price.

THE TOUR PRICE INCLUDES:

AIR TRANSPORTATION: By any IATA/ARC air carrier or other scheduled jet carrier, in economy class, with flights and air routings at the discretion of the air carriers and Nawas based on non-refundable bulk group fares. Cancellations made after air tickets have been issued are subject to full cancellation penalties as imposed by the airlines. We strongly recommend all tour members retain both their ticket receipts and boarding passes as copies of same cannot be provided. Airline tickets must bear your first, middle and last name as it appears on your passport. Passengers must apply directly with the airline for frequent flyer mileage; awards are at the sole discretion of the airline. Nawas makes every effort to provide the lowest possible price on our group tours and therefore does not guarantee the most direct routing to/from your final destination. Nawas is not responsible if an airline cancels, reschedules or delays a flight for any reason. Nawas is not responsible for and will not provide any refund for portions of trips missed due to canceled, rescheduled or delayed flights by any carrier.

TAXES/FUEL SURCHARGES: U.S.A. departure taxes, overseas airport taxes, overseas local government taxes, airline security fees/surcharges and fuel surcharges are included (taxes/surcharges current estimate is \$713 per person).

SURFACE TRANSPORTATION: By deluxe motorcoach.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS: Accommodations at first class/select hotels based on two persons sharing a twin or double bedded room with private bath. Nawas cannot guarantee roommates. A person taking a single room (subject to availability) must pay a supplement of \$750.

MEALS: Breakfast and dinner daily.

SIGHTSEEING: As specified in the itinerary using motorcoach transportation or other conveyances as required. Entrance fees and the services of local English-speaking guides or tour managers are included.

TRANSFERS: Assistance and transfers from airports to hotels and vice versa in private motorcoach.

SERVICE CHARGES, TAXES, & PORTERAGE:

Service charges and taxes normally included in bills, government taxes on hotel bills in effect on September 5, 2014, taxes on sightseeing and excursion trips and portage at hotels of one normal size suitcase (maximum weight 50 lbs.) are included in the tour price.

FLIGHT INSURANCE: Automatic one hundred thousand dollars flight insurance policy for each Nawas-ticketed passenger, subject to policy terms and limitations.

DEVIATIONS: All deviation requests from the group itinerary must be received at Nawas in writing no later than 100 days prior to departure. A \$100 non refundable fee per person will be charged on all deviations in addition to any extra airfare that may be incurred. Air deviations are subject to availability and restrictions as imposed by the airlines.

BAGGAGE: Airlines may now charge baggage fees for checked luggage on international/domestic flights based on the policy of each carrier. The maximum number of pieces of luggage, the weight allowance and baggage dimensions may also vary by airline from the USA to overseas destinations and beyond. Many carriers require that checked luggage in economy class not exceed 50 lbs with a combined length, width and height of 62 inches. Regulations vary for business/first class passengers. Airline policies regarding baggage are subject to change at any time without prior notice. It is the responsibility of each passenger to check with their airline prior to departure for baggage information, regulations and compliance. Please refer to your electronic airline ticket receipt once received with the final tour documents. Nawas is not responsible for additional fees imposed by air carriers regarding baggage. Due to space limitations on Nawas motorcoaches, Nawas can only allow one piece of luggage per person plus a carry-on bag with total dimensions of 45 inches which fits in the overhead bin or underneath the seat in front of you. Wheeled carry-on bags are not permitted due to limited motorcoach capacity. Nawas Travel accepts no responsibility for loss or damage to the tour members' baggage or personal belongings at any time. Baggage insurance is recommended and is available upon written request.

TRAVELERS REQUIRING SPECIAL ASSISTANCE:

Disabled travelers requiring special attention or care must advise NAWAS in writing at the time of reservation. A physically able companion must accompany any person who needs special assistance. Tour directors, guides, drivers or other tour, hotel or ship personnel are not able to provide such assistance. NAWAS is not responsible for any denial of services to the disabled participant by air carriers, cruise ships, hotels, restaurants or other independent suppliers. Certain countries/ destinations involve extensive walking. Be aware that outside the U.S. the Americans with Disabilities Act is not applicable and facilities for disabled individuals are limited. NAWAS is not responsible for any passenger requiring special medical equipment.

Passport fees, visa fees (if any), phone calls, valet/laundry service, wines, liquors, mineral water, after dinner coffee or tea, tips to escort, guides, drivers and waiters, sightseeing and other services not specifically mentioned, excess baggage and all other items of a purely personal nature.

CANCELLATIONS: Written cancellations received by Nawas Travel up to 100 days prior to departure, refunds will be made less a \$200 per person cancellation fee. From 99 to 70 days prior to departure, written cancellations received by Nawas Travel are subject to a \$400 per person cancellation fee. From 69 to 31 days prior to departure, written cancellations received by Nawas Travel are subject to a cancellation fee of 50% of the total tour price per person. From 30 days prior to departure, written cancellations received by Nawas Travel are subject to a 100% cancellation fee of the total tour price per person. No shows are subject to a 100% cancellation fee and reservations will be cancelled. Failure to receive final payment by the due date may result in the cancellation of your tour reservation and the forfeiture of your deposit. Airline tickets are not refundable once issued. Land costs are based on estimated 2015 tariffs, overseas government taxes and rates of exchange in effect on Sept. 5, 2014 and a minimum of 21 or more participants. While we have made the best possible estimates of what we expect costs to be in 2015, we cannot guarantee actual prices, exchange rates and airfares. Any increases in land costs or airfare that may occur will be collected from each passenger prior to departure. We reserve the right to increase the cost of the tour consistent with normal increases should the group fall below 21 persons, or in the event of fluctuations in exchange rates.
