

Brief Daily Itinerary

Depart New York

Monday, March 28

Evening departure for an overnight flight to Israel. Dinner and breakfast will be served on board plane in flight.

Tel Aviv - Joppa

Tuesday, March 29

Arrival in Israel and the Bible lands at the Ben Gurion International Airport at Lod (ancient Lydda in the Plain of Sharon). Visit of Joppa as time permits. From here the prophet Jonah set sail for Tarshish. Peter raised Dorcas and received instructions to go preach to the Gentiles (Acts 9-10). We will spend our first night at Netanya along the beautiful Mediterranean.

Caesarea – Haifa – Mount Carmel Megiddo – Nazareth – Tiberias

Wednesday, March 30

Drive north to Caesarea, first century Roman capital and seaport. The gospel was first preached to the Gentiles here (Acts 10-11). Paul was imprisoned here for two years before departing for Rome (Acts 24:27; 27:1). See Crusader's city walls, Herod's palace, the harbor, the Roman theater, and the aqueducts. Further north we arrive at Haifa, Israel's second largest city, industrial center, and seaport. Visit Murakah, the site associated with Elijah and the prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18). From here we have a view over the valley of Megiddo. In the Valley of Jezreel (the Armageddon of Rev. 16:16) we come to Megiddo. Visit the model at the visitor's center, see ruins of the city including the gates and stables. Walk through the ancient water tunnel. We will make a brief stop in Nazareth, boyhood home of Jesus. One of the highlights here will be a visit to the Nazareth Village, a



Herod's Palace at Caesarea Maritima reconstructed first century village and farm. Heading toward Tiberias we pass Gath-hepher, the home of Jonah (2 Kings 14:25), and the traditional Cana of Galilee (Jn. 2). For the next three nights we will stay at Tiberias on the Sea of Galilee.

Sea of Galilee Area

Thursday and Friday, March 31 – April 1

Special Note: Because there are so many points of interest in the Galilee area we have added extra time here. Visit all points of interest around the Sea of Galilee including sites for feeding of the multitudes, Sermon on the Mount, Bethsaida (home of Philip, Andrew and Peter), Capernaum (see ruins of the ancient synagogue and the "house of Peter"), Chorazin and Magdala. Cross the Sea of Galilee by boat. See the Cove of the Sower. Visit the ancient Roman boat at Nof Ginosaur. Drive past Kursi, En Gev, and the new excavations at ancient Tiberias as time permits. See the Jordan River.

Golan Heights – Mount Hermon Caesarea Philippi – Dan – Hazor

We plan to visit sites north of the Sea of Galilee. Drive through the Golan Heights (biblical Bashan), where one of the cities of refuge was located (Josh. 20:8), to view Mount Hermon. Visit Banias (Caesarea Philippi), a major source of the Jordan River, where Jesus made the promise that He would build the church (Mt. 16). Visit Dan for a tour of the archaeological excavations and another source of the Jordan. Continue through the Hulah valley for a visit of Tel Hazor. Hazor was the head of the northern Canaanite kingdoms captured by Israel (Joshua 11). Several excavations have brought to light important things at Hazor.

Bethshan – Well of Harod – Jezreel Up to Jerusalem

Saturday, April 2

Today we head south. Visit Bethshean, where the Philistines hung Saul's body on the wall (1 Sam. 31). Bethshean was known as Scythopolis in New Testament

times, and a city of the Decapolis. Stop at the Spring of Harod where Gideon chose his men (Jud. 7:1). See Mount Gilboa, Hill of Moreh, and Mount Tabor as we motor through the Valley of Jezreel. See the site of ancient Jezreel where King Ahab built a palace (1 Kings 21:1-2).

Driving south we pass Dothan (Gen. 37:17), and come to Sebaste, the hill of Samaria, which Omri bought, Ahab beautified and Herod the Great fortified. At Nablus, ancient Shechem, see Jacob's well (Jn. 4), Mt. Gerizim and Mt. Ebal (where the blessings and curses of the Law were read, Josh. 8).

Special Note: If conditions do not permit traveling through Samaria in the West Bank we will drive through the Jordan Valley to Jericho. From there we continue "up to Jerusalem" the Golden City. It will be home for the next five nights and a part of our life from now on.

Jerusalem - Bethlehem

Sunday, April 3

On Sunday there will be an opportunity for worship. Visit the Mount of Olives, with its magnificent panorama of the Old Walled City of Jerusalem. Excellent place for photographs from the Mount of Ascension (Acts 1:9). Pause in the Garden of Gethsemane. Continue to the City of David, Kidron Valley, Pool of Siloam and Hezekiah's tunnel. If time permits we will visit the traditional house of Caiaphas where Peter denied Christ. We will visit the Garden Tomb and the beautiful Garden at Gordon's Calvary.

One afternoon we will drive to Bethlehem where we will visit the Church of Nativity, the Grotto of Jerome and the Shepherd's fields. If time permits we will have a view of the Herodion where it is thought that Herod's tomb was found in 2007. A visit to the Second Temple

the Book (Dead Sea Scrolls), and the archaeology section of the Israel Museum complete the activities of the day.

Jericho – Dead Sea – Qumran – Masada Monday, April 4

Today we descend through the wilderness of Judea to Jericho (Josh. 2:1–6:20) where the walls fell down. Visit Jordan River baptism site and Qumran where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Driving south along the Dead Sea we pass Ein Gedi where David hid from Saul (1 Sam. 24), and come to Masada, Herod's rock fortress which overlooks the Dead Sea. Here, in A.D. 73, 960 Jews took their own lives rather than submit to the yoke of Rome. Return to Jerusalem for overnight.

Jerusalem

Tuesday, April 5

One morning we will walk through the Old City. We will visit the Western Wall and as much of the temple mount area as time and conditions permit. We often hear that the Temple Mount area is important to Jews because it is believed to be where Abraham offered Isaac, and where the temple stood. It is sacred to Islam because they hold

Model of Jerusalem from the time of Christ, the Shrine of that Mohammed took his flight into heaven from this spot. Christians know that the first gospel sermon was preached by Peter in this area (Acts 2). According to the early chapters of Acts, many of the activities of the early church took place in this area. Visit the City of David.

> Visit the Pool of Bethesda, the Via Dolorosa, Church of the Holy Sepulchre, and other sacred sites. A walk through the market area of the city is an unbelievable experience. The visit of Jerusalem will include the Cardo and other recent excavations in the Jewish Quarter (Broad Wall, Burnt House, and Herodian Mansion).

> We will visit the recent excavations in the Jerusalem Archaeological Park (Davidson Center) showing the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans in A.D. 70, and the steps leading up to the Temple in the time of Christ.

Jerusalem

Wednesday, April 6

Jerusalem is a unique city and visits to various sites require much planning. Moslem sites are difficult to visit on Friday; Jewish sites are difficult to visit on Saturday; Christian sites are difficult to visit on Sunday. Our guide knows how to make the most of our time as we visit the important sites. We will use some of the time today to visit sites we have been unable to visit on the previous days in Jerusalem.

Return to the U.S.A.

Thursday, April 7

Today we will depart from the hotel and begin our way to the airport for the evening flight. There is much to see as we drive through the Shephelah of Israel to sites such as the Valley of Aijalon, Beth-Shemesh and the Sorek Valley, Azekah, valley of Elah, Gath, Lachish, and the coastal plain. We will have dinner at a restaurant by the Sea.

This evening we depart for home carrying with us the wonderful memories of having walked in the footsteps of the patriarchs, prophets, Jesus, the Apostles, and early Christians. Our Bible reading will have more meaning

from now on, and our "world" will be a great deal larger.

RESERVATIONS, DEPOSITS and FINAL PAYMENT:

Reservations may be secured upon payment of a deposit of \$500 per person. No reservation is considered firm until deposit has been received. Your initial deposit payment shall be deemed to be an acceptance of all the terms of our General Conditions. Space is limited and offered on a first-come basis. Final payment is due at Nawas Travel 100 days prior to departure date.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: A U.S.A. passport valid for 6 months after the return date of the trip is required to travel. It is the sole responsibility of the traveler to check their passport's expiration date. Non-U.S.A. citizens may require visas in addition to a valid passport. It is the sole responsibility of non-U.S.A. citizens (including green card holders) to ensure they have the required visas/travel documents for each country to be visited on their tour and for re-entry into the U.S.A. Visa fees (if any) are not included in the tour price.

THE TOUR PRICE INCLUDES:

AIR TRANSPORTATION: By any IATA/ARC air carrier or other scheduled jet carrier, in economy class, with flights and air routings at the discretion of the air carriers and Nawas based on non-refundable bulk group fares. Cancellations made after air tickets have been issued are subject to full cancellation penalties as imposed by the airlines. Nawas is not responsible for and will not provide any refund for portions of trips missed due to canceled, rescheduled or delayed flights by any carrier.

TAXES/FUEL SURCHARGES: U.S.A. departure taxes, overseas airport taxes, overseas local government taxes, airline security fees/surcharges, and airline-imposed surcharges are included (taxes/surcharges current estimate is \$725 per person).

SURFACE TRANSPORTATION: By deluxe motorcoach.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS: Accommodations at first class/select hotels based on two persons sharing a twin or double bedded room with private bath. Nawas cannot guarantee roommates. A person taking a single room (subject to availability) must pay a supplement of \$860.

MEALS: Breakfast and dinner daily.

SIGHTSEEING: As specified in the itinerary using motorcoach transportation or other conveyances as required. Entrance fees and the services of local English-speaking guides or tour managers are included.

TRANSFERS: Assistance and transfers from airports to hotels and vice versa in private motorcoach.
